### FLORA AND FAUNA With Amy Weinmeister

June 19–23, 9:00 AM–Noon  
Ages 9–13

Use a variety of media (collage, tempera, oil pastels, and sketching) to explore our local flora and fauna. We'll spend time outside observing plants and animals, then return to the base camp to find out more about our specimens and depict them using the medium of the day. The week will end with an exhibit and presentation of our work!

We'll make and play a stump fiddle and a mouth bow and engage in storytelling and singing based on traditional Appalachian folk themes. Come enjoy Jack Tales, Uncle Remus, tall tales, and folk songs!

### CLAY: CIRCUS-WORLD MENAGERIE With Cynthia Zmetronak

Ages 8–12

Join the clay circus! Learn to work with clay as you make clay animals and clown masks. We'll experiment with slab and pinching techniques to create a clay circus, and then glaze and paint our pieces to finish with a colorful menagerie. Additional materials fee: \$10

### LET'S MAKE FURNITURE With Wyatt Severs

July 3–7, 9:00 AM–4:00 PM (full day)  
Ages 9–12

Join us for a fun week of exploring and talking about how things are made. Campers will create their own piece of furniture—a bench, table, or small cabinet—from dowel rods and wooden slats, add a unique finishing touch

with paint, and be introduced to metal work to make hardware for their piece. Campers will learn fun facts about trees and the role of trees in our environment. Additional materials fee: \$50
