DYING TO DYE WITH PLANTS (AND BUGS!)

with *Mirrah Johnson*

June 17–21, 9:00 am–noon

Ages 9–12

Tuition and materials: \$125

Come learn to use the colors of nature to dye fabric and yarn! We'll use foraged plants, food waste, magical natural indigo, and even tiny bugs to color and print our textiles. Create designs using resist blocks and plants we find outside our classroom. Through appreciation of the colors nature can provide, this camp will bring us closer to the earth!

Mirrah is a fiber artist and educator who has taught with the Frist Museum, Appalachian Center for Craft, Subs with SuitCASEs, Toe River Arts Council, and Mitchell County Senior Center.

FABULOUS FELT AND CLAY CREATIONS!

June 17–28, 1:30–4:30 pm

Ages 6–10

Tuition and materials: \$235 (two-week camp)

Join us for two weeks of fun with felt and clay. We'll dye raw wool and felt small story mats and backdrops; sculpt clay creatures and people; and craft stories from our imaginations. Students will also have the opportunity to create felt place mats and vessels to drink and eat from.

APPALACHIAN FOLK ARTS

June 24–28, 9:00 am–noon

Ages 4–7

Tuition and materials: \$115

Discover the Appalachian arts of folk singing, story telling, and making folk instruments and simple toys. We'll make and play a stump fiddle and a mouth bow, and engage in storytelling and singing based on traditional Appalachian themes. Come enjoy the Jack Tales, Uncle Remus, tall tales, and folk songs!

Sam is a folk musician and woodworker. He has worked with TRAC in the Enhanced Arts for Preschool program and as a resident artist in Mitchell County Schools. He has taught Kids Camps and with the Subs with SuitCASEs program.

EVERYDAY CLAY!

July 1–5, 9:00 am–noon

Ages 8–12

Tuition and materials: \$125

Each day we'll explore a new technique of building with clay to create tiles, pottery, and small sculpture. Skills we'll learn in class include coiling, slab building, pinching, and free-forming clay. Students will take away a broad understanding of the ceramic process and a diverse body of work.

INTRODUCTION TO WOODTURNING

Tuition and materials: \$160

In this class we'll learn the fundamentals of

woodturning: creating mallets, learning basic shapes, and building small projects in preparation for designing and creating legs for a stool, which will include learning how to make a wedged mortis and tenon joint.

Join us as we travel through different habitats and explore our space!

Ever wanted to make your own T-shirt? Put your designs on a bag? Come join us for DIY screenprinting. Learn how to turn your ideas into prints and put these on fabric or paper. DIY screenprinting will teach you how to put your image on a screen and then print with the screen on your material of choice. Get creative

and bring your art home on a shirt, bag—maybe even make a book with your prints!

Ani Volkan is an artist and educator. She teaches at Print League KC, a community print shop she runs in Kansas City, MO. She also works with the ARTventure camps to introduce kids the wonders of printmaking.

INSECTS IN ACTION with Christine Henry

July 15–19, 9:00 am–noon

Ages 3–6

Tuition and materials: \$122

We'll combine art, stories, music, and movement to create a fun and educational experience that's all about insects. We'll make wearable wings and playful puppets while learning about beetles, butterflies, and bugs!

Ages 9–12

Tuition and materials: \$120

There are so many kinds of pie in the world—sweet, savory, or even pizza pie. What a treat to make, bake and taste a variety. We'll get familiar with the baking ingredients and tools used to make pies as we learn how to measure, mix, chop, roll, and bake. Each participant will leave our class with a cookbook containing the recipes we made and a special tool to use in their home kitchen.

Alena Applerose is the baker at Penland School of Craft and has been creating art with children for more than 15 years. She has taught at Madison County 4H, Arthur Morgan School, Athens Cooperative Experience, Firefly Primitive Skills Gathering, Kids Camp, and Subs with SuitCASEs.

Tuition and materials: \$120

On our last day together we'll be doing some drumming and strumming, dancing and singing with our masks in a magical show of light

and sound. Come join the fun!

Campers will create their own piece of furniture—a bench, chair or table—from dowel rods and wooden slats, adding a unique finishing touch with paint. Campers will learn fun facts about trees and the role of trees in our environment.

Tuition and materials: \$115

Rescue a princess from a land of the frogs, help Perseus battle Medusa, trick a dragon out of his treasure; it's all in a day's work for the origami storyteller! Kids in this camp will hear stories and create origami characters and props to act them out and create their own stories to share! We'll create stars to go along with a Greek myth, a frog to accompany a Native American story, jewels as part of a dragon story, and much more! Come be an origami storyteller!

Professional storyteller Sherry Lovett has led a homeschool cooperative and taught homeschool classes. She has also taught camps for Poplar Grove Plantation, Kids Camp, and the Yancey History Association.
